



What's happening on Broadway

The Broadway malls from 145-153rd Street have been renovated with the support of Borough President Scott Stringer and by the design and construction team of the NYC Department of Parks & Recreation. The 8 malls are now open to the public.

Who takes care of the Broadway malls?

The Broadway Mall Association (BMA), a non-profit organization, maintains these malls in addition to all the Broadway malls from 70th Street to 168th Street. BMA provides plant maintenance, pruning, watering, and sanitation. We partner with the NYC Department of Health on pest control and we partner with the NYC Department of Parks and Recreation for sanitation and watering.

What can I do?

New plantings take several years of intensive care and maintenance to ensure survival. The BMA is committed to providing beautiful open space along Broadway. But we need our partner's support and the community's support.

If you see a lot of trash in the malls, call 311 or the BMA office at 212-491-6470 or info@broadwaymall.org. BMA is paying for trash collection on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday but it is not enough. Your calls and emails will help us get more support from our community partners. We also ask that local residents and merchants pitch in to put trash in proper trash cans and not on the street.
