Eligibility

- ✓ 18 years of age or older
- ✓ Parent
- ✓ Low Income (any of the following)
 - Unemployed
 - Earning less than \$35,000/year
 - Income below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level
- ✓ Interested in getting help finding a job
- ✓ Interested in improving/learning more about parenting skills
- ✓ Interested in improving relationship with co-parent and/or spouse or partner
