African Burial Ground National Monument Visitor Center is open Tuesday through Saturday, 10am to 4pm. The visitor center is closed on Thanksgiving and Christmas Day. The memorial is currently closed for the winter season. It will reopen April 1, 2015.

The activities will take place at the African Burial Ground National Monument, located on the first floor of 290 Broadway in Lower Manhattan, just north of City Hall. Upon entering the building, members of the public will have to go through security screening.
