

District Manager's Report April/May 2005

For the month of April staff had approximately 1,050 contacts (see attached).

Borough Services Cabinet – Next meeting May 20th.

District Services Cabinet – Highlights May 11th Meeting.

Police;

The 30th Precinct has seen it's overall crime drop 10% from a year ago at this time, and 13% Month to Date. The largest crime problem the command is having according to Inspector Winski is the theft of Cell Phones. They will be working with City College Security starting the night before commencement with special concern to breaking in to vehicles. There is no pattern of crimes against Senior's (CB9 member Pat Lewis asked).

The 26th Precinct has seen crime INCREASE by 21.25 % since a year ago at this time, with Burglary leading the way up 56%. They too have a problem with theft of Cell Phones, especially NEXTEL which is the EASIEST TO TRANSFER OWNERSHIP, because of a slide chip (?) in the back, this according to Inspector Cassidy.

Housing Bureau – Sgt. Toussaint reported that crime is up in Manhattanville & Grant Houses by 7%. For April they did 179 Verticals, and issued 96 Quality of Life Summonses. They have identified two perps in break ins at Grant Houses, and are seeking to pick them up.

FDNY – Roger Montessano brought literature (see attached)

DOT – Mr. Eastmond said they will institute 3 locations with angle parking approved by the Board, and are still reviewing initiatives for 125th and Amsterdam, including Don't Block the Box.

NEW York City Human Rights – James Berry indicated that one of the Landlords cited for failing to make his building Handicap Accessible was on Riverside Drive. Of twenty Schools targeted for the Peer Counseling Program four are in CB9M.


