

January, 2010 District Manager's Report

Highlights from the District Service Cabinet Meeting held 1/13/10:

FDNY is offering free bystander CPR training to all New York City residents. The program takes less than an hour and each participant is given a free CPR training kit to bring home to friends and family. As part of an ongoing initiative, as of January, 2010 FDNY will begin offering training sessions once per week in each borough that are open to anyone. As the CPR Unit generally trains groups of 20 or larger, these sessions will be an opportunity for individual smaller groups interested in receiving training. The sessions are administered by the FDNY EMS personnel and can be taught in English and Spanish. (see Flyer)

Department of Health – reported Raccoon rabies advisory in Manhattan - Rabid raccoons were recently found in Central Park and Morningside Park. - 1) Get your cat or dog vaccinated for rabies(It's the law);
- 2) Stay away from wild or stray animals. Keep children and pets away from them too. (Raccoons, skunks, bats, and stray cats are more likely than other animals to have rabies);
- 3) If you are bitten by an animal, wash the wound, consult a doctor, and call 311 to report the bite.






