

January District Manager's Report

District Service Cabinet Meeting minutes of meeting held on 1/11/12:

26th Pct. Reported (see stats): The overall crime categories is down, however shootings have increased with a total of ten (10) reported in 2011, with 9 arrests made mostly youth related. On Friday, December 9, 2011, at approximately 1:00 p.m., an off-duty police officer was involved in a shooting incident within the subway station located at W.125 Street and St. Nicholas Avenue. The incident began when two females were sexually assaulted in the train station by a male black approximately 22 years of age. The first female that was sexually assaulted left to get help, when the incident came to the attention of an off-duty police officer. It was reported that as the first female went to get help the perpetrator began sexually assaulting the second female. The off-duty police officer responded and confronted the perpetrator who began to fight with the off-duty officer and resist arrest. In the ensuing struggle the officer's firearm was discharged and the perpetrator was struck once in the back. The incident is currently being investigated by the Police Department, and the perpetrator is being held at Riker's Island until arraignment.

On December 27, 2011 at approximately 09:30 p.m., two officers were in the process of dispersing a disorderly group of teenagers in front of **The Leather Lounge Club**, located at 454 West 128th Street, when they heard numerous gun shots from the vicinity of West 128th Street and Convent Avenue. Preliminary investigation of the shooting scene revealed that a 1994 Honda Accord was struck in the front windshield causing a bullet hole in the rear windshield causing the window to shatter. Inside the vehicle, was a female Hispanic (identity known to the department) who states that she heard the gun shots but could not identify the perpetrator. The female Hispanic/victim was not injured in this shooting. An evidence search was conducted and ten shell casings were recovered from the scene.

At approximately 11:36 p.m. on the same night, officers responded to a radio call of a male shot from the emergency room of St. Luke's Hospital. When they arrived, they discovered that a 14 year old male Hispanic sustained a gunshot wound to his left leg. Following an interview, the victim states that while walking northbound on the west side of Amsterdam Avenue and W.130 Street, he observed a fight occurring across the street on the east side of Amsterdam Avenue. The victim then heard three gun shots and began to feel pain in his left leg. The victim was placed into a vehicle by two of his friends and taken to St. Luke's Hospital. The victim's shooter is unknown and was unable to provide a description. A second crime scene was established at the location of occurrence, with negative results on the search.

Patrol Borough Manhattan North Reported (see stats): 115 new officers were assigned to the 28th, 30th, 32nd, and 34th Precincts. New Officers will also be deployed city-wide if needed.

30th Pct. Reported (See Stats): A Missing Person, Ian Hunter Burnet, 22 year old white male, 5'8", approximately 132lbs, brown hair, and green eyes has been missing since December 30, 2011.. Mr. Burnet left his Richmond, VA residence on December 26, 2011, and traveled to New York City by bus to visit friends. Transit District #3 Reported: Increase in I-Phone thefts on subway, a Occupy Wall Street participant was robbed of an laptop, and I-Phone at the 125th Street and St. Nicholas Ave. Station; increase in homelessness in the subways at the 103rd, 110th, and 116th Street stations on the Broadway line (#1).

FDNY Reported: Fire safety educators conduct training, provide lectures and fire safety demonstrations in elementary schools, at tenant association meetings and at community and senior centers free of charge. Training sessions address the common causes of fire and fire injuries in the home, as well as provide information on how to prevent fires and what to do in case of fire. It was also stated the fire safety education programs target those most vulnerable to fire, young children and older adults.

1994 Carbon Monoxide Detectors with a shelf life of 5-7years must be replaced; landlords are responsible for all replacements. Rumors circulating that tenants experiencing a beeping sound from their detectors should not contact the FDNY are false; the FDNY should be contacted immediately.

Manhattan D.A.'s Office (see stats) Reported: On November 18, 2011, a jury in New York State Supreme Court found Vincent Heyward guilty of multiple felonies, including eighteen counts of Predatory Sexual Assault. It was proven at trial; Heyward violently attacked five women during a two-month period in 2009.

The D.A. announced the sentencing of Vincent Heyward, 23, to 200 years to life with a consecutive sentence of 228 years in prison following his conviction at trial for a series of violent sexual attacks on five women in Hamilton Heights and Chinatown. Thanks to the successful use of forensic DNA evidence in the investigation, this criminal has been held responsible for a monstrous pattern of violence against New York women.

Sanitation Registering Emergency Snow Laborers: The Department of Sanitation is now registering emergency snow laborers who can be called upon to remove snow and ice citywide from bus stops, crosswalks, and from step streets in sections of the City after heavy snowfalls. The rate of pay begins at \$12 per hour and increases to \$18 per hour, after completing the first 40 hours, each pay week.

Interested individuals can register at any DSNY garage between the hours of 7 AM to 3 PM, Monday through Friday. The Manhattan District 12 garage is located at 301 West 215th Street between 9th Avenue & the Harlem River in Inwood. The District 10 garage is at 110 East 131st Street between Lexington & Park Avenue and the District 9 garage is at 125 East 149th Street between Bronx Gerard Avenue & Walton Avenue.

Applicants must be at least 18 years of age, be eligible to work in the United States, and be capable of performing heavy physical labor. All applicants must bring their social security card and a photo copy of it; two (2) small photos (1 1/2" square) and two (2) original documents and photo copies that prove identity and employment eligibility, such as a driver's license; federal, state or local identification; school identification with photo, or passport, at time of registration. 

To register, you must bring your child and the following required documentation to the program for registration: proof of birth (birth certificate or passport), verifiable proof of residence (two documents), and immunization records.
