

District Manager's Report July/August 2008

Meetings attended:

August 8th – Attended Harlem Week Meeting

Highlights from the Harlem Week 2008 Inter-Agency Meeting:

Tony Rogers of Greater Harlem Chamber of Commerce (GHCC) announced a change in start line for the Walk-A-Thon - the walk will start at 116th Street for approximately (3) miles ending at Brad Hurst and 155th Street (see attached "Turn-by-Turn Course description")

It was stated that the Harlem Walk-A-Thon will be an Annual Event to promote Health Awareness in the Community, to combat obesity and diabetes, and to support organ donation. The Walk will take place through Historic Harlem and will visit (3) of Harlem's Great Parks beginning at Morningside Park and ending at Jackie Robinson Park.

Mayor Bloomberg has been appointed Chairman of the overall walk; City Councilwoman Inez Dickens will Chair Morningside Park; NYPD Commissioner Kelly will Chair St. Nicholas Park; Dept. of Parks and Recreation Commissioner Adrian Benepe will Chair Jackie Robinson Park. Each Park will be set up with Elected Officials (2) at each Park and the following Organizations providing information and/or services:

- New York Colleges
- Historic Black Colleges
- Hospitals – providing Health screenings and Medical facilities for Runners
- Cultural Organizations & National Organization
- Employment
- Voter Registration
- Financial Institutions
- Celebrities, including Entertainment and Sports
- Health Services organizations

A lounge will be set-up at Morningside Park to provide messages for Runners, and Salsa and Swing dance instructions will be provided at Jackie Robinson Park.

There will be a \$20.00 registration fee for all walkers and contributions will be accepted to support GHCC Health Initiative

The Police raised a concern regarding how long streets would be closed along route; one suggestion was to open streets after walkers finish each block along route. However it

was noted that this would be impossible because there would be gaps in the route with walkers walking at different paces.

DOT also stated that buses would have to be terminated between 110th to 155th Street along St. Nicholas Avenue if the Walk-A-Thon moves ahead as described.

Tony Rogers announced that there will be another meeting scheduled on August 17th or 18th to address these and any other concerns and to finalize details with all Agencies involved.

Highlights from District Service Cabinet Meeting held 08/13/08:

PO Jason Harper (Community Affairs) Reported on the CompStats for the 26th Pct. (see attached)

PO Harper also stated that National Night out was a huge success with Assemblyman Daniel O'Donnell; City Council Member Robert Jackson; Parks Commissioner Adrian Benepe; Borough Commissioner Bill Castro in attendance. Youngsters were given prizes and educated on the meaning of National Night Out and City Government.

Sgt. Buonadonna of the 30th Pct. Stated that DI Shanley hurt his hand and would not be able to attend the meeting. DI Shanley was wished a speedy recovery.

Sgt. Buonadonna reported on the CompStats for the 30th Pct. (see attached)

Sgt. Buonadonna also stated that National Night Out was a huge success Community Board Member Carolyn Thompson was presented with a Certificate of Appreciation for her many services to the 30th Pct. It was stated that a minor incident occurred on Edgecombe bet. (145th – 155th) which was not related to the Event.

Maria De LaRosa of the DA Office reported that they have 59 Summer Interns who will mock a trail at the end of the program

Sanitation Supt. Jorge Gabino of Manhattan 9 reported that the District is a lot cleaner around the Precinct area. 12th Avenue has had baskets delivered to improve Restaurant Row and an Adopt-A-Basket program has been implemented

Josh Ozerck of DOT reported on the following:

- Resurfacing is almost completed in the district including Manhattan Avenue.
- A letter of request was sent to the Board requesting Speed reducing bumps I/F/O the Dance Theatre of Harlem (152nd Street bet. Convent and Amsterdam Avenue)

- Farmer's Market "No Parking Signs approved for Manhattan Avenue (bet. 110th – 111th Streets
- Signage improved for Bike Path along 135th Street and the Henry Hudson Parkway

Pat Jones, Chair, of CB9M reported on a complaint from Floridita Restaurant; specifically underground work that Columbia has begun will be a disruption to Floridita's business when it moves to 129th Street (requiring closure of 129th Street). DOT said they would follow-up and also checks the permit that has been issued for the work.

Mr. Jamison of Human Rights Commission reported that in March 2008, the Administrative Code of the City of New York was amended making "lawful source of income" a protected class under the City's Human Rights Law. Currently the law prohibits the owners of building in NYC with six or more apartments from refusing to rent or otherwise dispose of property to any person due to their income.

DEP reported that Spray Caps for hydrants will be provided upon request.

DDC reported District Manager's Conference held in May a booklet describing the following projects was issued 1. Frederick Douglas Circle (78% completed); 2011 Catch Basin.

Pat Jones announced to the Agencies that at the next General Board Meeting Mr. McClean (former DM) would be resented with Citations from Elected Officials and a Plaque from the Community Board all were invited to attend.

Course Revision – August 8, 2008


- Start – Near 116th Street and Morningside Avenue (heading North)
- Proceed on Morningside Avenue to 125th Street
- Right Turn onto 125th Street going East to St. Nicholas Avenue
- Left Turn onto St. Nicholas Avenue, going North to 136th Street
- Right Turn onto 136th Street, going East to Malcolm X Blvd / Lenox Avenue
- Left Turn onto Malcolm X Blvd / Lenox Avenue to 139th Street
- Left Turn onto 139th Street, going West to St. Nicholas Avenue
- Right Turn onto St. Nicholas Avenue, going North to 141st Street
- Right Turn onto 141st Street, going East to Bradhurst Avenue
- Left Turn onto Bradhurst Avenue, going North to Finish at 155th Street
- Finish – Bradhurst Avenue and 155th Street

PLEASE NOTE:

Due to the change of the start location from 110th Street to 116th Street, the course is measured at approximately three (3) miles. Pending a review of the actual park and entrance locations, we are planning to finish the walk inside the park. Once this is established, we will contact the appropriate partners for approvals.



Harlem Walk-a-thon Turn-by-Turn Course Description




Map Page 3 of 4
