

June, 2010 District Manager's Report

Highlights from the District Service Cabinet Meeting (6/10/10)

PSA-6 – (See Stats)

Domestic Violence is on the rise, PSA-6 is hosting a Domestic Violence Forum during the Summer. Family Day will be held on the following dates: Manhattanville Houses (8/14/10, and Grant Houses (8/21/10); National Night Out will be held on August 3, 2010 at the Polo Grounds Housing Development.

Residential Graffiti Removal should be reported to 311, once reported Sanitation will power wash graffiti at no cost to landlord; \$500 reward for the Report and Apprehension of Graffiti Vandals.

Patrol Borough Manhattan North (See Stats)

Rape reported as #1 Crime in District, in all reported incidents victim was known to attacker; Explorers scheduled to hand out Flyers reminding Store Owners the selling of Fire Works is illegal and all violators will be charged to the fullest extent of the Law.

DA's Office (See Stats)

Manhattan DA Cyrus R. Vance, Jr., launched a newly formed Hate Crimes Unit. This Unit will strengthen the Office's existing work in investigating the prosecuting hate and bias crimes. District Attorney Vance also announced the appointment of a veteran prosecutor, Assistant District Attorney Joan Illuzzi-Orbon, as Chief of the Unit.

As part of DA Vance's hate crimes initiative, the Office will collaborate with the New York City Police Department and community organizations to develop strategies that seek to prevent bias motivated crimes, whether based on religion, ethnicity or sexual orientation.

Manhattan DA Cyrus R. Vance, Jr., announced the expansion of the Office's Vehicular Crimes Unit. This expansion will enhance the resources and abilities of the Manhattan District Attorney's Office to investigate, prosecute and prevent vehicular crimes. In addition, the DA's Office will work more closely with the NYPD in investigating these cases, advocate for new legislation to strengthen the state's vehicular crimes laws, support local New York City vehicular safety law enhancements, and host a training summit this fall for law enforcement from across the state.

Sanitation

Reported DOT has been requested to replace missing street cleaning signs throughout various locations within District 9, which will allow the mechanical sweepers to clean the streets; Sanitation also requested that DOT install signs allowing loading and unloading for Tractor Trailers on 12th Avenue.

Parks

Repainting of 148th Street Playground along the Hudson River Parkway; Parks and NYPD have kept strong presence at Playground warning no alcoholic beverages allowed; Fire Works will be displayed on the Hudson River July 4th, Parks Staff and NYPD will be present at the West Harlem Piers Park, In celebration of July 4th, the Henry Hudson Highway will be closed from 23rd thru 125th Streets; Fish Festival (Catch and Release) is scheduled for 6/26/10.

St. Nicholas Park (Plaza) is participating in the City-wide Initiative "Make Music" a Piano will be installed at the Park on 6/21/10 thru 7/5/10.

Pools – All Pools in the District are scheduled to open on Thursday, July 8, 2010.

Libraries

Reported, a proposed City budget reduction of \$37 million to NYPL, it was stated that 10 branches will be closed with others open 4 days only; 5.7 million fewer items circulated ; 23,600 fewer programs and classes; 2 million fewer computer sessions; and 736 staff positions eliminated. The NYPL is urging Community Residents, Organizations, and Elected Officials to join the Letter writing campaign opposing NYPL Budget Cuts. (See attached Letter to Mayor Bloomberg, Speaker Quinn, and City Council Members). Over 80,000 petitions opposing the proposed Library Budget Cuts were collected.

Robert Jackson's Office

Reported a drop in the Census since it has gone into the numerator phase; July 10, 2010 Relay Event at Riverbank State Park 9am to 11pm participants will walk the track promoting and raising funds for Cancer Research.

Announcements:

RiverBank State Park – Operating hours have been restored to full operation.

MTA – The 125th Street Viaduct Repainting Project is scheduled to commence on Monday, June 14th, 2010 and last for one year. During the phases of the project that will include

structural cleaning and the removal of loose paint, the work areas will be enclosed with tarps and a vacuum will be used to collect the debris. MTA NYC Transit and its contractors are required to abide by all applicable Federal, State and City regulations regarding the removal of paint. In order to perform this project on the elevated track structure, access to the roadway and the temporary modification of traffic flow directly adjacent to the active work areas will be restricted. All applicable permits for the modification of existing traffic regulations have been obtained from the NYC Department of Transportation as follows:

- Two lanes of traffic in each direction will be maintained along Broadway;
- Project-required equipment will occupy the roadway directly adjacent to the median on both sides of the work area; and
- Vehicular traffic will be shifted to the curb-side and middle lanes in each direction along Broadway.

Due to the width of the roadway adjacent to the project area, parking for private vehicles will be temporarily suspended along Broadway between LaSalle Street and West 133rd Street for the duration of this work.

Manhattanville Health Station located at 21 Old Broadway, 2nd floor is providing free HIV testing; STD testing; PAP Smear; EC Pill; and Hepatitis B Vaccine.

Public Advocate Bill de Blasio released a comprehensive charter revision proposal that would enhance government transparency and accountability, foster a new level of civic engagement, and help restore the balance of power at City Hall. There were also four(4) critical points that the Public Advocate has proposed to strengthen and support Community Boards;


- 1). Independent Budgets for Community Boards
- 2). Providing Community Boards with a resource center in each borough with an Officer of Urban Planning;
- 3). Categorizing Community Boards as 501 C3's and giving them non-profit establishment assistance so they are able to fundraise
- 4). Developing a Community Benefit Agreement Tracker to insure that communities get their fair share from developers.






