

District Manager's Report March & April 2005

For the Month of March staff had approximately 1,120 contacts (see attached) with the most after Board Business persons seeking information.

Borough Board – Next Meeting April 29, 2005

District Services Cabinet – Highlights April 13th Meeting

DEP – has extended it's Evening Hours to assist with Property Lien problems (see attached)

FDNY – spent a large part of the winter checking on CO2 monitor follow up but were down in total responses (see attached)

Police – the 26 Precinct and Transit District 3 are year to date up in crimes compared with 2004, but began to show a fall off last month. PSA 6 completed a Drug Bust in Grant Houses on August 7th (see attached Press Release), while the 30th Precinct's crime figures are down. Note COMPSTAT figures in Uniform Services/Transportation Minutes.

The largest area of upswing in crime is with Identity Theft*, and Illegal Cell Phone accounts charged to an unsuspecting person.* The 30 Precinct made a bust of a stolen credit card at 3333 Broadway where the perpetrator was another resident of the same complex who was in possession of ten other stolen name articles.
