

March, 2012 District Manager's Report

Borough Service Cabinet Meeting – Highlights

Presentation on Notice of Value - Ms. Samara Karasyk, Assistant Commissioner of External Affairs at the Department of Finance, presented on the annual Notice of Value. The Department of Finance sends this document in January to NYC property owners. It informs owners of their property's market and assessed values. The property value is used to calculate their property taxes for the next tax year which begins July 1st. The July property tax bill shows the amount owed in taxes based on the new property values.

Ms. Karasyk also explained that exemptions may be updated for the next year. Property benefits are mentioned on their website at: www.nyc.gov/html/dof/html/pdf/nopv/nopv.pdf. Property owners must fill out an exemption application to get a list of the exemptions and abatements their properties are eligible for, or to apply for a property exemption.

Presentation on Rooftop Revolution -Stephen Corson, Deputy Director of Policy & Research for Borough President Stringer shared a new report entitled "Rooftop Revolution". The report is the culmination of a six month research effort that used the NYC Solar Map, a web-tool developed in June 2011 by Sustainable CUNY, to calculate the environmental and economic benefits of installing solar panels on nearly 1,100 public school rooftops in New York City. The report provides new projections and statistics and is the first broad based application of the NYC Solar Map to be published. Some key statistics from the report:

- Installing solar panels on every public school rooftop in NYC would create an estimated **5,423 green collar jobs**;
- **169.46 megawatts** of solar could be installed on school rooftops. (For reference, one megawatt is enough electricity to power approximately 1,000 homes);
- Installing solar panels on every public school rooftop in NYC would increase the city's solar capacity by **over 2,500 percent** (NYC has only 6.5 megawatts of installed solar);
- Installing solar panels on every public school rooftop in NYC would eliminate **76,696 tons of carbon** from the air each year which is the equivalent of planting **over 400,000 trees**;
- There is over **20.7 million sq ft.** of usable space for solar panels on public school rooftops. This is enough space to cover **57 percent of Central Park** with solar panels.

The report recommends that the City develop a long-term plan to install solar panels on every public school roof and that a state bill called the Solar Jobs Act is passed which would help make the installation of solar panels on schools and elsewhere more cost efficient.

District Service Cabinet (DSC) Meeting Highlights:

Fire Dept. reported:

- Engine Co. 47 and 80 were given citations for Cardiac Arrest

- Structural Fire at 3333 Broadway, B-Tower, 6th floor tenant was referred to Red Cross for assistance.

26th Pct reported (see Stats):

- Reported increase in Gang Activity; 3-Stacks (Grant Houses), and the CMB (Manhattanville) were involved in a shooting incident on March 8, 2012 leaving one male black shot in the leg. It was reported the witness is uncooperative in investigation; weapon recovered currently in ballistics for screening.
- Auxiliary Officers have been deployed at Middle School and High Schools through the district to deter gang activity

PSA6 reported (see Stats):

Patrol Borough Manhattan North (see Stats):

- Reported increase in burglaries, and grand larceny; thefts directly associated with electronics.
- Basketball League Championship Basketball Games Trophy Ceremony taking place immediately following the last game scheduled for: Saturday, March 31, 2012, at P.S. 192 (School Gym), 500 W. 138th Street, 10 thru Noon. (see Flyer)

DEP Reported:

- Hudson River Café received a Noise Violation in January-2012, and a follow-up inspection took place 2/4/12 by the Environmental Control Board; currently awaiting findings;
- The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and New York City Department of Environmental Protection announced an agreement on an enforcement Order to improve the overall water quality in New York Harbor waters. Under this agreement, the City will invest approximately \$187 million over the next three years and an estimated \$2.4 billion of public and private funding over the next 18 years to install green infrastructure technologies to manage storm water before it enters the City's combined sewer system. The City maintains the flexibility to prioritize green investments in areas of the City that will benefit most from the resulting reductions in combined sewer overflows.
- Environmental Protection Commissioner Carter Strickland announced that DEP has issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for three separate engineering and design services contracts to create green infrastructure master plans within three combined sewer watershed areas: Gowanus Canal, Flushing Bay, and Newtown Creek. The selected consultant or consultants will be required to design cost-effective green infrastructure projects on the streets and sidewalks and city-owned buildings in these areas. Among the projects to be built are bioswales, blue and green roofs, rain gardens, and porous pavement, all of which can reduce combined sewer overflows and ultimately improve harbor water quality. During storms, parts of New York City's combined sewer system often reach capacity, and must discharge a mix of storm water and wastewater — called a combined sewer overflow, or CSO — into the city's surrounding waterways.

- DEP estimates that by this summer, the selected consultants will begin the process of identifying bioswale locations and producing designs for public building retrofits. Consultants will work with DEP to finalize the designs, produce construction documents, and provide design services through construction. The total value of the three contracts is \$12 million.

The three contracts will cover the following areas:

- **Contract Area #1: Gowanus Canal and part of Newtown Creek** (approximately 775 acres): The total cost of this design contract is \$4,000,000.
- **Contract Area #2: Flushing Bay** (approximately 1,000 acres): The cost of this design contract is \$5,500,000.
- **Contract Area #3: Flushing Bay** (approximately 450 acres): The cost of this design contract is \$2,500,000.

DOT has issued a request for proposals for private companies to provide a bike share system in New York City.

Bike share will serve as a new public transportation system, complete with durable bicycles and docking stations to provide convenient and inexpensive mobility twenty-four hours a day, 365 days a year.

NYC Bike Share, is proposing to create a self-service bicycle sharing program in portions of Manhattan and Northwest Brooklyn with satellite locations in areas of Queens, the Bronx and Staten Island. The Program will initially be a network of approximately 10,000 publicly available bicycles which would be located at 600 automated stations in the Program area, available 24 hours a day, and 365 days a year.

Bike Users may take a bicycle from any station and return it to any other station in the system, which creates a new transportation option for short, one-way trips for commuting, running errands, or visiting tourist attractions. To access bike share, users must purchase a membership

on a long-term (annual) or short-term (weekly or daily) basis. Members are then entitled to borrow bicycles for an unlimited number of short trips (duration of the initial time period to be determined, but likely be 30 or 45 minutes). Members would pay additional fees for trips that extend beyond the initial time period. A trip would end when the member returns the bicycle to another bike share station. Sheltered Bike Parking

In response to the ever growing number of cyclists and to promote cycling as a healthy, environmentally-sustainable form of transportation, DOT in coordination with our Coordinated Street Furniture vendor, Cemusa, is installing Bicycle Parking Structures around the City. 20 have been installed to date out of a total of 36. Each shelter contains stainless steel bike racks for eight bikes. The design closely resembles the award-winning Bus Shelter, using the same high-quality materials. The ad panels are used to display the annual NYC Cycling Map and the Look Public Service Campaign or other bicycle promotional materials. These structures do more than just provide parking - they send a message that the City encourages cycling.
