

District Manager's Report
April/May 2004

For the month of April staff had approximately 1,387 contacts (see attached), with the majority after Board Business being those seeking information about Jobs, in general and for Summer Youth.

Borough Board (see attached), the highlights from the April 23rd meeting was plans for a Manhattan Tour after the May 20th Borough Board, and the dispute between the Comptroller's Office and the Parks Department over Tree Planting. According to Parks the Comptroller wants them to use Labor for planting that costs \$40.00 per hour instead of the landscaper line they prefer at \$15.00 per hour. Since all this comes out District Services Cabinet (see attached), the highlights from the May 12th meeting is that while crime in the 26th and 30th Precinct is up for the Year to Date, most major Statistics were down in April.

Sanitation said we had the best overall District wide Clean streets report in two years. of a set budget Parks feels that LESS trees will be planted under the Comptroller's directive.

May 7th I attended the Girl Scouts Basketball tournament actually held off the Grand Concourse.

May 10th I attended City Council Speaker Miller's Summit on The city's Level of Emergency Preparedness, with Morning and Afternoon Panel discussions (see attached). I will speak to certain points at the General Board on May 20th.

FY 2006 – It is time to begin the process for making Budget requests for the FY 2006 Fiscal Year which runs from July 1, 2005 to June 30, 2006. Based on the Fall Budget Consultation schedule which includes the Jewish Holidays and Labor Day Board 9 will have to change the regular meeting date for at least two or three nights including the General Board.

Senior's Event – The Senior's Issues Committee Annual Celebration For Senior's Month went very well with over fifty attendees. The Committee acknowledged the helped of Treasurer Barbara Marshall who picked the donations from various Business in Board 9. Public Advocate Betsy Gotbaum had a Proclamation issued to both Co Chairs Sylvia Robinson, and Sadie Winslow naming the Day for them in honor of their work with the area's Seniors. The Department for the Aging also sent a declaration honoring the Board.


