

# May, 2010 District Manager's Report

## Highlights from the District Service Cabinet Meeting (5/12/10)

**FDNY – Fire and Emergency Medical Services Exploring Program** is a division of the Learning for Life organization under the leadership of the Boy Scouts of America for young men and women, ages fourteen through twenty. The FDNY Fire and Emergency Medical Services Exploring Program seek to help young men and women:

- Gain insight in FDNY Careers and help develop a road map for their futures;
- Develop the tools necessary for successful school- to-career and school-to-higher-education transition;
- Develop potential contacts that may broaden student' employment options at FDNY.

In order to participate as an Explorer, young men and women must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Must be 14 to 21 years of age
- Must show proof of enrollment in HS, College, or GED Program;
- Must show obedience to parents and adults

Currently the FDNY Fire and Emergency Medical Services Exploring Program have seven active posts with Explorers operating in Brooklyn, the Bronx, Queens and Harlem. (See Flyer attached)

**Libraries** – Reported a proposed City budget reduction of \$37 million to NYPL, it was stated that 10 branches will be closed with others open 4days only; 5.7 million fewer items circulated ; 23,600 fewer programs and classes; 2 million fewer computer sessions; and 736 staff positions eliminated. The NYPL is urging Community Residents, Organizations, and Elected Officials to join the Letter writing campaign opposing NYPL Budget Cuts. **DOT** – Reported the 2010 Recycling Maps and Truck route Maps are available.

**DOB** – Reported On Monday, April 26 (Construction Safety Week 2010), Buildings Department Commissioner LiMandri was joined by New York City Fire Department Commissioner Cassano and Office of Emergency Management Commissioner Bruno, launched the Department's sixth annual Construction Safety Week, a week-long series of events aimed at raising awareness about safe construction practices across the City.

**RiverBank State Park** – Operating hours will change from 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. on Monday, May 17, 2010 to the following operating hours: Monday through Friday 11:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.; Saturday and Sunday 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m.

**MTA** – The 125<sup>th</sup> Street Viaduct Repainting Project is scheduled to commence on Tuesday, June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2010 and last for one year. During the phases of the project that will include structural cleaning and the removal of loose paint, the work areas will be enclosed with tarps and a vacuum will be used to collect the debris. MTA NYC Transit and its contractors are required to abide by all applicable Federal, State and City regulations regarding the removal of paint. In order to perform this project on the elevated track structure, access to the roadway and the temporary modification of traffic flow directly adjacent to the active work areas will be restricted. All applicable permits for the modification of existing traffic regulations have been obtained from the NYC Department of Transportation as follows:

- Two lanes of traffic in each direction will be maintained along Broadway;
- Project-required equipment will occupy the roadway directly adjacent to the median on both sides of the work area; and
- Vehicular traffic will be shifted to the curb-side and middle lanes in each direction along Broadway.

Due to the width of the roadway adjacent to the project area, parking for private vehicles will be temporarily suspended along Broadway between LaSalle Street and West 133<sup>rd</sup> Street for the duration of this work.

# Manhattanville in West Harlem Campus Plan

Construction Activities for the Next Two Weeks

**O**ver the next three decades, Columbia's long-term plan for the old Manhattanville manufacturing area will revitalize the four former industrial blocks from 125th/129th to 133rd Street between Broadway and 12th Avenue, and three small blocks along the east side of Broadway from 131st to 134th Street, into an environmentally sustainable and publicly accessible center for academic and civic life woven into the fabric of the West Harlem community.

## Construction Activities for the Weeks of: May 10, 2010 and May 17, 2010

### Utility Improvements

#### New Water Main Installation

##### *What is happening*

- Installation of a new 48-inch water main along the west side of Broadway. This work entails the tie-in of this new water main with the existing water main at both West 130<sup>th</sup> Street and Broadway and West 129<sup>th</sup> Street and Broadway.

##### *What to expect*

- Work hours: 7:00 a.m.—6:00 p.m.
- Activities include saw cutting, trenching, excavation, sheeting installation, permanent roadway restoration, pipe installation, pipe welding, backfill and steel plate covers over work areas
- Temporary closure of the eastern-most southbound traffic lane on Broadway between West 129<sup>th</sup> Street and West 131<sup>st</sup> Street. Two southbound traffic lanes maintained on Broadway at all times.
- Temporary no parking restrictions
  - West side of Broadway between West 131<sup>st</sup> Street and West 129<sup>th</sup> Street
  - Underneath elevated train on Broadway between West 130<sup>th</sup> Street and West 129<sup>th</sup>
- **Night work:** Excavation and sheeting at the intersections of Broadway and West 129<sup>th</sup> Street and Broadway and West 130<sup>th</sup> Street is scheduled from March 22nd through May 21st from 9:00 p.m.—6:00 a.m. per DOT regulations. This work will require utilizing two southbound lanes on Broadway between West 131st Street and West 125th Street. One southbound traffic lane will be maintained at all times. The intersections of West 129<sup>th</sup> and Broadway and West 130<sup>th</sup> and Broadway will be closed during this work activity. Please note that some of this work will generate some noise. We will do our best to keep noise to a minimum.

## Combined Sewer Installation

### *What is happening*

- Installation of a new combined sewer along 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue between West 125<sup>th</sup> Street and St. Clair Place
- Installation of a dewatering treatment system underneath the Riverside viaduct on 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue between West 125<sup>th</sup> Street and St. Clair Place

### *What to expect*

- Work hours: 7:00 a.m.—6:00 p.m.
- Activities include excavation, installation of the dewatering system, installation of the combined sewer, installation of sheeting, installation of sewer chambers and driving piles for sewer chambers on 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue between West 125<sup>th</sup> Street and St. Clair Place
- Temporary closure of two traffic lanes on 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue between West 125<sup>th</sup> Street and St. Clair Place. Temporary closure of one traffic lane and eastern parking lane on northbound Riverside Drive from St. Clair Place to West 125<sup>th</sup> Street. Pedestrian walkways will be maintained.
- Temporary no standing restrictions:
  - No standing on 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue between West 125<sup>th</sup> Street and St. Clair Place
  - No standing on Riverside Drive from West 125<sup>th</sup> Street and St. Clair Place
  - No bus layover zone on the 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue spur
- Possible street closure of West 129<sup>th</sup> Street between Broadway and West 125<sup>th</sup> Street starting the week of May 24<sup>th</sup>. The street closure will be in effect for three (3) months.

- Demolition of select buildings in the block bordered by 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue, West 131<sup>st</sup> Street, Broadway and West 129<sup>th</sup> Street

### *What to expect*

- Temporary no standing zone in areas of West 131<sup>st</sup> Street between Broadway and 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue

- Installation of sidewalk bridges, scaffolding and construction fences
