

District Manager's Report

October/ November 2004

For the month of October the staff had approximately 1,100 contacts (see attached).

District Services Cabinet – Highlights from the November 10th meeting will be given at the General Board (2005 Schedule attached CB9 members packet).

Snow Season – Effective November 8th Sanitation moved the bulk of their collection crews from the Day (6A.M. – 2P.M.) to the Evening Shift (4P.M. – Midnight) in anticipation of Snow Removal. This will of course affect the times that trash in the area is picked up.

Attached you will find Community Board 9's Snow Removal Policy worked out annually in conjunction with the District Service Cabinet.

FY 2005 Budget – The District Office submitted the Board's Priority list for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2005 (see attached in yellow) on October 29th, on time for the twelfth consecutive year.

Seniors Issues first steps to success – It has come to the Board's and Seniors Issues Committee that after years of writing and prodding on the topic of Free Transportation for our Older Adults that Assemblyman Keith Wright sponsored legislation in the Assembly, cosponsored by Assemblyman O'Donnell among others. There is a sister Bill in the State Senate. We hope to have the entire wording by the General Board. Congratulations to the Committee and Public Member Herbert Crews who initiated this issue (see attached).

Claremont Avenue – On Friday October 29th I met with residents of the Buildings on Claremont to hear their concerns, and look at the option of them forming a Block Association. Also in attendance were Officers Parks, and Hartigan of the 26th Precinct, This meeting was hosted by the International House at 155.



Officer Parks brought up the issue of a speed bump on Tiemann Place eats bound at Claremont to slow down drivers who run the stop sign after coming off Riverside Drive.
