Dear General Manager Apple:

Thank you for your letter of June 27 outlining NYCHA policy for Community Board use of community rooms.

First, I would like to say that NYCHA housing is very important to our boards. We consider affordable housing a priority and NYCHA housing especially essential for our communities. Our intention is always to better serve all of our residents, which includes NYCHA residents, some of whom are our Community Board members and staff.

The Community Boards are all too aware of NYCHA financial difficulties and would never want to interfere with a source of revenue. Our intention is to reserve rooms when they are not booked for another use. We are aware of meeting times for tenant associations and regular meetings and work around those schedules. I would assume that a reservation for a paid use for a room would almost 100% of the time be booked more than two weeks in advance as people would need to send out invites or other announcements. Your community center managers would be able to confirm this.

Community Board meetings serve the residents, businesses, and organizations of the community. These are opportunities for residents to participate in planning and decision making for the community, including budget priorities, land use, transportation goals, and all other planning. We always need to hold meetings in centers that are accessible to the public. This means accessible for the disabled, and also accessible by public transportation and accessible geographically. Holding meetings in various NYCHA centers provides excellent opportunities for residents who do not generally attend meetings to be able to participate. This is especially true for many of our seniors living in NYCHA housing. These meetings serve our NYCHA residents and should be encouraged. We ask that you reconsider your policy for Community Boards and make available unused space without rental fees as we work to serve your residents.

Just to clear up a few other points. Community Boards are not quasi-governmental agencies; we are government agencies. Regarding e-mail communication, we requested this to be easier for all concerned. We are aware that not all centers have full time managers, and it may take a day or two to receive an answer. However, we are happy to communicate by e-mail through Jenell Mitchell as you request.

We look forward to continued discussion of this policy, and we thank you for your time and concern.






