

September, 2009 District Manager's Report

The following was reported at the Borough Service Cabinet Meeting June 26, 2009:

Dr. Sheila L. Palevsky, Professional Education Unit, DOH reported the following:

H1N1 Flu is caused by a virus similar to regular (seasonal) flu. 32 deaths have been reported as of 6/8/09 in New York City, there are two types of vaccines (regular vaccine and the newly patented vaccine) it is recommended that everyone get both. The H1N1 illness can cause fever, cough, sore throat, tiredness, aches, chills, and stuffy nose. H1N1 flu spreads when a sick person coughs or sneezes. You can also get infected by touching something with flu viruses on it and then touching your own mouth or nose. You can protect yourself from H1N1 flu by not getting close to people who are sick, keeping your hands clean by washing with soap and water and (by using hand sanitizer). Most people recover without medication, but some people are more likely to get severely ill with the flu. Those at risk include everyone over 65, under 2 or pregnant, and anyone with other long-term health problems, such as asthma or diabetes. If you belong to one of these groups and you come down with symptoms of flu, call your health care provider right away to get a prescription. 26th Pct. (See Stats)

D.I. Shanley- Reported that there have been four (4) Sexual Assaults in Hamilton Heights since August 1st Suspect is still at large (see Sketch). The Precinct has increased patrols from 6pm – 8am; Verticals are being conducted in buildings. Transit Police are increasing Patrols around the local train stops from 8pm – 6am. Crime Stoppers is also offering materials on how to protect yourself. The 30th Pct. is offering Seminars at City College and Columbia University on self awareness, and protection.

The 30th Pct. is working with Block and Tenant Associations within Hamilton Heights to obtain a listing of street light outages to submit to DOT.

Parks –reported that permits have increased for Park Events during the Summer Parks also reported a major alcohol bust at the Park on 148th @R/S/D, 900 bottles of alcohol was confiscated as well as beer and a popular new drink “Nut Cracker” which is bottled professionally as a fruit juice. The individuals were charged under an Administrative Code violation and Summons were issued.

Fire Department – Reported on Semi-Annual hydrant inspection, the importance of spray caps; and the importance of not parking I/F/O hydrants. The Pilot Hydrant Education Action Team) HEAT was a huge success. The Program was offered in Washington Heights, Brooklyn, and Queens. The Program educates individuals on the importance to use sprinkler

caps; the dangers of wasting water; how the pressure from an open hydrant can push people especially children into traffic. The Program is currently funded under the SYEP and is hoping to be spread across all Five Boroughs.

DEP – Reported that Noise complaints on 12th Avenue have decreased and that the restaurant owners are adhering to the requirements. **Maria Callado reported that she will be leaving DEP as of September 25, 2009, she will be relocating to Puerto Rico.**

DOT – Reported on the installation of traffic Median at 12th Avenue @ 132nd Street which is a huge success. A Traffic Survey was conducted at Amsterdam @125th Street and it was qualified for a left turn, will inform Board of effective date.

Martin Smith commended the local Precincts and DA's Office for their ongoing work in apprehending the Hamilton Heights Rapist.

North River Sewage Treatment Plant is questioning a report submitted by DEP regarding the transfer of toxic waste from its East River Plant to the Hudson River; DDC reported odors from Plant during transfer.




