Four(4) Officers have been assigned to the 26th Precinct; Residential Graffiti Removal should be reported to 311, once reported Sanitation will power wash graffiti at no cost to landlord; \$500 reward for the report and apprehension of Graffiti Vandals.

DEP announced properties (Commercial and Private) with delinquent water bills will have Leans placed on their properties, DEP is offering Forgiveness Programs for those who are eligible. Please visit their website at www.nyc.gov/dep for further info.

Sanitation -Reported DOT has been requested to replace missing street cleaning signs throughout various locations within District 9, which will allow the mechanical sweepers to clean the streets; Sanitation also requested that DOT install signs allowing loading and unloading for Tractor Trailers on 12th Avenue.

Parks –Repainting is under way at the 148th Street Playground along the Hudson River Parkway; Parks and NYPD have kept a strong presence at Playground warning no alcoholic beverages are allowed;

MBPO announced an agreement on the State Funding for Student Metro Cards, the MTA and the State Legislature have reached a funding agreement that keeps the Student Metro Card program running, which is a relief to parents and students across the city.

DOT - Milling and Resurfacing is scheduled the week of September 12 to September 18, 2010 at the following locations: 148th Street (Riverside Drive to St. Nicholas Ave.); and Broadway (145th – 155th Streets); Speed Bump will be installed at 123rd Street (bet. Morningside and Amsterdam Avenue); DOT announced the approval for 1500 City-wide Count Down Signals.

Dept. of Health – Reported new compact Trash Containers are being tested at two locations in District 9 (113th and Morningside & 117th Street and Morningside), this pilot program is part of the NYC GoGreen initiative.

Public Advocate Bill de Blasio released a comprehensive charter revision proposal that would enhance government transparency and accountability, foster a new level of civic engagement, and help restore the balance of power at City Hall. There were also four (4) critical points that the Public Advocate has proposed to strengthen and support Community Boards;

- 1). Independent Budgets for Community Boards
- 2). Providing Community Boards with a resource center in each borough with an Officer of Urban Planning;
- 3). Categorizing Community Boards as 501 C3's and giving them non-profit establishment assistance so they are able to fundraise
- 4). Developing a Community Benefit Agreement Tracker to insure that communities get their fair share from developers.

MTA – The 125th Street Viaduct Repainting Project has begun, and will last for one year. During the phases of the project structural cleaning and the removal of loose paint from the viaduct will occur, the work areas will be enclosed with tarps and a vacuum will be used to collect the debris. The MTANYC Transit and its contractors are required to abide by all applicable Federal, State and City regulations regarding the removal of paint. In order to perform this project on the elevated track structure, access to the roadway and the temporary modification of traffic flow directly adjacent to the active work areas will be restricted. All applicable permits for the modification of existing traffic regulations have been obtained from the NYC Department of Transportation as follows:

- Two lanes of traffic in each direction will be maintained along Broadway;
- Project-required equipment will occupy the roadway directly adjacent to the median on both sides of the work area; and
- Vehicular traffic will be shifted to the curb-side and middle lanes in each direction along Broadway.

Due to the width of the roadway adjacent to the project area, parking for private vehicles will be temporarily suspended along Broadway between LaSalle Street and West 133rd Street for the duration of this work.
