Presentation and discussion:

St Agnes Apartments Landmark efforts.-Gladys Tinsley was asked to spearhead effort. Confirmed that Joel Mentor will write resolution with assistance from Gladys Tinsley. Joel Mentor asked how long landmark efforts had been going on for the St. Agnes Apts. Gladys Tinsley indicated efforts had been going on since the 1980s. Arnold Boatner mentioned that it can take many years to landmark a building. There was also brief discussion on The Rainbow Room being a landmark.

Old Business:

Recap of 3320 Broadway landmark modification application being pursued at the Landmarks Preservation Commission. Resolution has been approved by General Board and been sent to LPC.

New Business:

Mac Levin of Concrete Safari an East Harlem after-school program outlined a request for a letter of support being sought for a two day race event in September. Event will be an 11 mile obstacle course race as a benefit to expand the after-school program Race will run through community districts 9, 11 and 12. Committee recommended that she attend the next Youth and Education Committee meeting and the General Board meeting to present her proposal and to contact elected officials to seek their support
