TK and filming: noted that a listing of sites had been incomplete and that the areas were smaller than that staked out with no parking signs. We were promised that the person in charge of filming would come to the December meeting.

Member of Committee: Hairbraiding store between ST Nich and Morningside and 125<sup>th</sup> street: People are spilling out onto the sidewalk – We will look into it

TK and commercial traffic on Claremont, Riverside Dr, and Convent - Promised that a detail would deal with it.

**PSA 6: Officer Pender**

Agreed that the numbers were up, but in the most recent period, he noted that they were down  
Told us that the Mayor has a plan to bring down crime in public housing [it represents 5% of housing  
in the City, but 15% of the crime]

Noted that there is a large number of parolees and sex offenders there and the crimes are violent and  
drug related. Are uniting parole, NY Housing, NY Police, and DA Office to bring crime under  
control.

**Sanitation: Tom Fitzgerald**

Expalined the Mayors Solid Waste plan

For us, no changes, the Transfer Station will remain closed

Part of the pain is to increase recycling to 25% by '07 [it is now 21%]
