

# Enterprise Photo Gallery

- An enterprise photo gallery tool has been created and is available for agency use.
- It enables users to view image collections on your site on NYC.gov
- It is designed to be flexible
  - Flexible structure: Images can be organized by location, date, type, etc.
  - Image size and shape: macro, thumbnail and standard size images can be uploaded for each photo
  - Informational Fields: There are fields that can be used for further description of photos, events, etc.
  - Web administration tool: A web interface is used to create and maintain the photo gallery
- There are two main components:
  - Administration: Used by the agency to create and maintain the photo gallery
  - Viewing: End-user tool to view and search the photo gallery collection

- Built on the Vignette Portal using Java
- Admin portlet
  - Permissioned through Vignette so that only to those with permission to administer a specific photo gallery can access it
  - Built using Eclipse
- Viewing portlet
  - Accessible to everyone
  - Built using Eclipse
- Business logic EJBs
  - This is the meat of the application. The EJB framework provides persistence, portability, and other features that would otherwise have to be custom built
  - The EJBs were written using Weblogic Workshop.

Google Implementation

- DoITT is implementing the Google Search Appliance in June/July 2005.
- The Google tool is a complete solution that includes hardware and software bundled together which will index up to 500,000 web-enabled documents.
- Individual agency sites will now benefit from enhanced search capabilities and search result pages.




- It has the same award-winning technology and features as Google's internet search service, including:
  - Search using natural language including Boolean AND, OR, and NOT searches.
  - Search KeyMatch functionality to force search results.
  - Automatic Spell-Check.
  - Ability to configure keyword or phrase matches and also define synonyms for agency-specific acronyms or terminology and have those terms displayed as suggested alternative queries.
  - Meta Tags which can be used to help define specific search results.
  - Unlimited end user interfaces which means that we can develop different look and feels for the various agencies.
  - Reporting tool to show the most popular searches.
  - Continuous Crawler: Intelligent, real-time content crawling for fastest content updating.

- **Enhanced Email Campaign**
- **Capabilities**

- In the Spring of 2004, NYC.gov implemented the City's Enterprise Email Campaign Management tool, Vignette Messenger.
- At the same time, NYC.gov launched the first custom news registration pages for agency specific news categories.
- As a result, the opt-in rate skyrocketed and now boasts over 110,000 registered subscribers.
- An issue arose when agencies sent out mass emails through their own agency accounts to lists of people who hadn't opted in.
- Resulted in allegations of spamming from NYC.gov.
- City then adopted a policy that large email campaigns would need to be managed through the Vignette Messenger opt-in registration process.

- DoITT consulted with Gartner on best practices concerning mass email campaigns.
- This led to the replacement of the single opt-in process with a double-opt-in solution.
- DoITT implemented Double-opt in by making some modifications to the Vignette Messenger registration module so that it can verify registrants email addresses.

- The user clicks on the Sign up for Email Updates icon which is conveniently located on the NYC.gov homepage.



- The user is then taken to the NYC.gov Email Updates page.
- We've added language to explain the new process.


- The prospective registrant receives a confirmation email that contains a link to verify their account. The link that the user clicks contains a randomly generated number (which is stored in the database for each user).



- Based on the users selected categories, the system may offer agency specific registration pages for related news as well as a link back to the Email Updates page for the user to sign up for additional updates.



- If the users email address cannot be verified an error message will be displayed as follows:



- With thoughts of adhering to and exceeding industry best practices, NYC.gov implemented unprecedented Email a Friend abuse prevention strategies for the purpose of preventing the tool from being used maliciously.
- The functionality allows users to email specific NYC.gov content to individuals from a mail link on the site.



- When the user clicks on the email icon, a form pops up with the following information:
  - Content Headline
  - A text field for the user to enter the sender's email address with an option to check the "Copy Me" box.
  - A text field to enter the recipient's email address.
  - A CC field.
  - A text box for users to add a personal note.
  - Send and Cancel button.
  - Links to Privacy Statement and Comment on Email a Friend Service.
  - NYC.gov logo to take users back to the homepage.





- Once the user finishes and clicks the 'Send' button to submit, an email will be generated and sent to the recipient immediately.
- The user is taken to a confirmation page which confirms that the email has been sent. This page also highlights the most popular pages that have been requested to be sent via email.



- The recipient receives an HTML version (or a plain text alternative) of the email along with their friends' comments and a link to the article.
- The recipient will also receive top NYC.gov headlines which encourages them to visit the four main sections of the NYC.gov Web site: Residents, Business, Visitors and Government.
- While these headlines currently highlight the portal, this space can also be used as agency ad space for upcoming events or ongoing programs.



- The Email a Friend functionality was originally conceived to be used in conjunction with TeamSite templates, however, code has been modified to allow for use by all NYC.gov agencies.
- Agencies currently have the option of either using the default position on Email a Friend icon (bottom left) or do a custom placement (top right).
- Two examples are: DOH using the default placement at the bottom, and DHS using the custom placement.

STATEMENT ON NYC AIDS COMMISSION REPORT

NEW YORK CITY - March 31, 2005 - The New York City Commission on HIV/AIDS has been working for several months to develop recommendations on how New York City can improve its response to the HIV/AIDS epidemic, which has ravaged our communities for the past quarter century.

Earlier this week, Housing Works placed an early draft of the report on its website. While it is gratifying to know that Housing Works "heartily supports" most of the recommendations in this draft, it is unfortunate that the organization chose to disseminate the report before New York City HIV/AIDS Commission members had sufficient time to provide input into the document. The first draft of the report neither fully nor accurately represents the Commission's positions.

After Commission members have had time to review, we will, as planned, release the report for public comment. At that time, we welcome all constructive comments and suggestions on how to make the report and its recommendations even stronger. We expect a draft of the report to be placed on our website for public comment in approximately two weeks.

Our goal is to stop the spread of HIV, control the epidemic, and ensure that all people living with HIV or AIDS receive the best possible treatment and care. We look forward to working with community partners and all concerned to achieve that goal.

Mayor Bloomberg Announces Salary Increases for Employees at Not-For-Profit Service Providers

*City will Fund 12% Raises with the Possibility of an Additional 2% from Productivity for Employees of Contract Human Service Providers*

May 4, 2005 - Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg today announced that New York City will provide nearly \$70 million for salary increases for approximately 13,000 employees at 400 social service agencies across the City. The money will raise salaries for social workers, cooks, custodians, clerical aides, drivers and other employees who have not received raises since January 1st, 2001 and who work at not-for-profit agencies that contract with the Department of Homeless Services (DHS), Administration for Children Services (ACS) and the Department for the Aging (DFTA). The Mayor was joined by Michael Stoller, Executive Director of the Human Services Council, DHS Commissioner Linda Gibbs, ACS Commissioner John Mattingly, DFTA Commissioner Edwin Méndez-Santiago and Labor Relations Commissioner James Harley.

"Taking care of our senior citizens, children and homeless is demanding work that deserves our respect, gratitude and support," said Mayor Bloomberg. "I am pleased that the City will fund salary increases for employees who work at contract agencies and additional increases will be funded by productivity. I want to thank the Human Services Council for their creativity and innovation. By working together we will provide larger and more competitive salaries for their employees and better service for New Yorkers."

- The security safeguards put in place for the Email a Friend functionality are unprecedented in the industry in the handling of potential abusers.
  - **Blocked Sender:** Enforces that certain individuals who have been identified as abusers will not be allowed to send emails.
  - **Unwanted Receipt:** Allows the ability for users to request that they do not want to receive emails from NYC.gov.
  - **URL Security:** Most “Email A Friend” type applications are open for the URL spoofing attacks – the attacker uses the system to send his/her own URL, in the official email. To help eliminate this type of abuse, our application checks the domain of the URL to send against known/acceptable domains. Also we retrieve the relevant information directly from the “to be sent” page in order to prevent any other information spoofing.

**PROCEDURE FOR PRE-APPLICATION MEETINGS AND DRAFT APPLICATIONS**

Pre-application Meetings are designed to facilitate communication between potential applicants and the BSA of draft proposals that may require discretionary relief.

Such meetings are conducted on an informal basis and are not bearing on the ultimate outcome of the case if an application is filed. Although the BSA greatly favors the use of the application Meeting process, an application may be filed even though a meeting was not held.

Draft Applications, which are an adjunct to the application Meeting process, are submitted for staff-level review prior to formal filing. This review is designed to reduce comments on the Notice of Objections, and to ensure that applications, which are later sent to community officials, and neighbors, have fewer deficiencies.

**The Garibaldi-Meucci Museum**

In the heart of Rosebank is the historic home of the pioneer inventor, Antonio Meucci, and legendary hero, Giuseppe Garibaldi. **The Art Commission** is New York City's design review agency. Established in 1898, the Commission's mandate is to review works of art, architecture and landscape architecture on City-owned property for aesthetic merit. Projects include construction, renovation or restoration of buildings, such as museums and libraries; creation or rehabilitation of parks and playgrounds; installation of lighting and other streetscape elements; and design, installation and conservation of artwork.

The Commission is composed of 11 members, who serve on a pro bono basis, and includes an architect, landscape architect, painter and sculptor as well as representatives of the Brooklyn Museum of Art, the Metropolitan Museum of Art and the New York Public Library. The Commission holds monthly public hearings in its offices on the third floor of City Hall, where it has resided since 1914. The Commission also acts as caretaker and curator of the City's public art collection and maintains an extensive archive documenting the history of New York City's public works.


