

Voting with a Paper Ballot is Easy – And All Voters Can Receive Additional Assistance!



In addition to voting with a paper ballot, all voters can use a Ballot Marking Device (BMD) on Election Day.



Using the BMD, voters can:

1. See the ballot on a screen and enlarge the text
2. Listen to the ballot read through audio headphones

Voters who decide to use the BMD can select from four ways to mark their ballots:



Touch Screen



Braille Key Pad



Sip & Puff Device



Rocker Paddle



Mark your ballot using a BMD with these easy steps:



- Pick up your paper ballot and privacy sleeve at the sign-in table from the poll worker.
- Insert your ballot into the feed tray and select your preferred language.
- Select each candidate and/or issue for which you intend to mark a vote. Your selection will be highlighted in yellow on the screen. You can enlarge the text and hear the options read through headphones if you so choose.
- Make sure the oval is filled in black.
- After completing your ballot, review your selections. To change a selection, select the contest or issue you would like to change and reselect the proper choice. Once finished, select "NEXT" to return to the summary screen.
- When finished marking your ballot, select "NEXT." Select "Mark Ballot" to print your marked ballot.
- Take your printed ballot to the scanner area. If you would like assistance inserting your ballot into the scanner, a poll worker will assist you.
