About NYCHA

The New York City Housing Authority (NYCHA) provides decent and affordable housing in a safe and secure living environment for low and moderate income residents throughout the five boroughs. NYCHA also administers a citywide Section 8 Leased Housing Program in rental apartments.

About the Summer Graduate Internship Program

NYCHA is one of several agencies participating in New York City's Summer Graduate Internship Program. These internships allow students to make important contributions to the City while participating in a challenging and rewarding work experience.

Internship positions do not have a specific start and end date but may be held for a maximum of 13 weeks during the period from May through September.

To complement the work experience, graduate interns participate in a special seminar series that features top City officials presenting overviews of municipal government, specific agencies, and the latest issues confronting the City.

Criteria for Participation:

To participate in the Summer Graduate Internship program, graduate students must be currently enrolled in a graduate program or have been accepted into a graduate program that will start in the fall of 2011.

Salary Range

The salary range for Graduate Internship positions for 2011 is \$427.50 to \$720.50 per week.

Internship Opportunities
