<p>1. All tenants must register their pets on a one time basis; this includes tenants who reside in senior citizen buildings/developments.</p> <p>2. THERE IS A ONE-TIME, NON-REFUNDABLE PET REGISTRATION FEE OF \$25.00. A check or money order payable to NYCHA must accompany this Registration form.</p> <p>YOU DO NOT HAVE TO PAY ANY REGISTRATION FEE IF:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Your pet is a verified Service Animal, or • You live in a building designated exclusively for Senior Citizens. <p>3. Pet registration is a <u>two part process</u>: 1) Residents must submit this Dog and Cat Registration form, along with the pet registration fee, as applicable, and 2) have their pet examined by a veterinarian and submit a Dog and Cat Veterinarian Certification form within 90 days of receipt of the Veterinarian Certification form, signed by the veterinarian.</p> <p>Registration is not complete until both forms are submitted.</p> <p>4. <u>You have to submit a new Pet Registration form and new Veterinarian form again only if you get a new pet. However, no additional registration fee will be required.</u></p>

PET RULES and TENANT CERTIFICATION		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dog / Cat: A household may own either one dog or one cat. • Size limit - Dogs: Dogs that are expected to weigh over 40 pounds when full grown are not permitted. • Pet Conduct: Pets must be kept in a manner that will not create a nuisance, not create excessive noise, not create an unsafe or unsanitary condition, not cause harm or threaten other people or animals and not damage any property, whether inside or outside of an apartment. • Dangerous Pet: Animals that are vicious, threatening or otherwise prohibited by law are forbidden. • Pet Waste: Pet owners must clean up after their pets, both in their apartment and in public areas. Dispose of pet waste, including cat litter box filler, in the compactor with the regular garbage. Do not put pet waste in the toilet. • Dog Leash: A dog must always be kept on a leash, six feet long or less, while in a public area. • Pet-Free Zone: Pets must not be allowed to enter a designated "no-pet" area, such as the Management Offices, playgrounds, Community Centers, laundry rooms, basement areas, barbecue areas, roofs and roof landings. • Spay / Neuter: Dogs and cats must be spayed or neutered. • Vaccination: Dogs and cats must have a current rabies vaccination. • Dog License: A dog must be licensed and must wear its license tag when in public. <p>I understand that I may be held liable for any injuries to people or damage to property caused by my dog or cat. I hereby certify that I have no other dogs or cats that I have not registered. I understand that the filing of false statements or violation of any NYCHA pet rules may subject me to service charges, exclusion of my pet from all NYCHA premises or termination of my lease.</p>
