

# NYCHA TO OPEN ITS SECTION 8 WAITING LIST FROM February 12 to May 14, 2007

The New York City Housing Authority (NYCHA) will open its Section 8 waiting list to non-emergency applicants\* starting February 12, 2007. Section 8 applications will be accepted through May 14, 2007. After May 14, 2007 NYCHA will again close its Section 8 waiting list to non-emergency applicants.

### Obtaining a Section 8 Application

A new yellow Section 8 application (Form# 039.003 Rev. 11/06) is immediately available. Applications can be sent to NYCHA but will not be officially accepted by NYCHA until February 12, 2007. Applications are available at all NYCHA Borough Applications Offices and Management Offices. Applicants may also go to our website to request a Section 8 application through the mail. Applications are free.

NYCHA is currently conducting eligibility interviews for families who filed Section 8 applications in 1993 and 1994. \* Note: In December 1994, NYCHA closed its Section 8 waiting list to non-emergency applicants. Emergency applicants are currently defined as intimidated witnesses, victims of domestic violence, and applicants referred by the NYC Administration for Children's Services.
