

Tribeca Film Fest every week

If you're feeling overwhelmed by the summer blockbuster season and couldn't make it to the Tribeca Film Festival, then turn to NYC TV for your indie fix. The city's official television station, whose production office is in Downtown's Municipal Building, recently announced a summer schedule that included the third season of "NYC TV Presents Tribeca Film Festival."

The weekly series premiered in the Fall of 2002, when NYC TV's creative director, Seth Unger, said he realized that the festival, then in its first year, would be a "perfect match" for the station's mission to "showcase great new things happening in New York City," he said. Each week the show features participants and attendees of that year's Tribeca Film Festival. The actors, directors, organizers and critics discuss industry issues from the June 25 preview's examination of marketing to this week's episode "Politics in Entertainment."
