

**NYC TV gets 48 local Emmy nods**

**The city's "official network" received the most nominations in its history, with nearly two dozen for Secrets of New York.**

NYC TV, the official network of New York City, has been nominated for 48 New York Emmy Awards, Mayor Michael Bloomberg said Thursday.

The total number of nominations is the most New York Emmy nominations ever received by NYC TV, and broke last year's record of 34, the Mayor said.

Secrets of New York a show that exposes the history and stories behind New York City's infrastructure, received 21 of the 48 nominations.

"Since we launched NYC TV in 2003, we have transformed the city's station into a leader in local television and an integral part of our efforts to showcase New York City to a global audience," said Mr. Bloomberg in a statement.

The New York chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences has 2,000 members. This year's Emmy Awards will be presented at a gala at the Marriott Marquis in Times Square on Sunday, April 6.
