

## WORLD TRADE CENTER HEALTH SCREENING

In February 2007, Mayor Bloomberg commissioned a special panel to examine the health impact of 9/11. In their report, *“Addressing the Health Impacts of 9/11”*, it was recommended that all city employees including retirees who were exposed to the World Trade Center collapse have an initial evaluation or screening at an approved program.

The World Trade Center Monitoring and Treatment Program provide free, confidential medical monitoring examinations.
