

# **Police Impersonation and Grand Larceny Pattern**

The New York City Police Department is asking for the public's assistance in locating a suspect wanted in connection with a citywide police impersonation and grand larceny pattern.

The suspect calls victims, usually elderly women between the ages of 77 and 98, claiming to be a police officer involved in an investigation concerning their bank accounts. The suspect states that he needs money from the victims' accounts to assist in a police investigation. The victims are then asked to meet the suspect and hand off large sums of money to him. The victim is never contacted by the suspect again.

## Please be cautious of phone calls that solicit money

The NYPD never solicits money.

What to do if you receive a phone call from someone claiming to be a police officer:

- o Request the person's name and rank
- Never meet with anyone asking for money
- o Do NOT give any of your personal information
- Call your local precinct (<a href="http://on.nyc.gov/1cvRf8M">http://on.nyc.gov/1cvRf8M</a>) or the NYPD Internal Affairs Bureau (212-741-8401) to report the call

- If you receive a call write down as much information as possible, ask for written material and report them to:
