



What should I do if I am unable to appear for the hearing?

You can reschedule the hearing if you call at least five business days before the first scheduled hearing date. Please call the Tribunal at (718) 391-5718.

If it is less than 5 days before the scheduled hearing date, you must appear before an ALJ at the Tribunal office and ask the ALJ for an adjournment. The adjournment will only be granted if the ALJ determines that you have a good reason.

What should I do if I missed the hearing date?

If you did not appear on the hearing date, you may have been found guilty by default.

You can request a new hearing after a default. Please visit the OATH website at www.nyc.gov/oath to find out how to reopen your case after a default.

What is the OATH Tax & Limousine Tribunal?

The OATH Tax & Limousine Tribunal is a division of the NYC Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings (OATH). This court holds hearings for summonses issued by TLC. OATH Tax & Limousine Tribunal judges are independent decision-makers who will hear your case.

Why did I get a Summons?

The OATH Tax & Limousine Tribunal does not issue summonses. If you need more information, call the NYC Taxi and Limousine Commission (TLC).

Your License

OATH is separate from TLC. TLC is the agency responsible for enforcing rules and issuing licenses. For questions about your license, please contact TLC.

What can I do if I get a summons?

Admit & Pay the Fine

- If a specific fine is designated on the front of the ticket, check the “guilty” box on the back of the ticket, follow the instructions and mail it with your payment within 14 days after receiving the summons.
- You may also pay in person at any Tribunal office. Pay by cash, money order, credit cards, or debit card. The JFK tribunal will not accept credit or debit cards.
- If your summons indicates “personal appearance required” and a specific fine is not written on the front of the summons, you may not plead guilty by mail and you must come to the tribunal.

- Non TLC licensees **must** appear personally.

What should I expect if I chose to come to a hearing?

You do not need an attorney, you can represent yourself. However, you may hire an attorney or an authorized representative if you choose.



A TLC representative may be present at the hearing.

- The hearing will take place in a hearing room before an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ). The ALJ has the authority to decide whether or not you are guilty of the charge.
- You may bring witnesses to testify for you. You may also bring any papers that you want the judge to consider.
- After the hearing, you will be directed to the waiting room where you will receive the ALJ's decision.

Interpretation services are provided free of charge, in over 150 languages, or you may bring a translator if you prefer. Some of the languages are:

Points

The ALJ must assess points when required by law. TLC licensees are assessed points when convicted of certain violations of TLC rules.

- Points are added to a licensee's record using the date of the violation, not the conviction date.
- Accumulation of 6 or more points during a 15 month period could result in the suspension of your license by TLC.
- Accumulation of 10 or more points during a 15 month period could result in revocation of your license by TLC.

What should I do if I disagree with the judge's decision?

- You can file an appeal within 30 days of the decision.
- If your appeal is filed correctly you do not have to pay the fine until a decision on the appeal is made.
- Appeals must be submitted using the OATH Taxi & Limousine Tribunal appeal form. The appeal form is available at Tribunal locations and on the OATH website in the Taxi & Limousine Tribunal section.
