**DOMESTIC VIOLENCE EMERGENCY SHELTER\***

There are 2,724 domestic violence emergency shelter beds citywide, a 35% increase since January 2002.

**DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CALLS FOR ASSISTANCE\***

Police responded to 249,440 domestic violence incidents in 2010; this averages to over 680 incidents per day. In addition, NYPD's Domestic Violence Unit conducted 67,761 home visits in 2010, a 77% increase since 2002.

As of 3/31/2011 the City's Domestic Violence Hotline advocates answered 28,010 since the beginning of the year. In 2010, the City's Domestic Violence Hotline advocates answered 119,177 calls, averaging more than 320 calls per day.

**DATING VIOLENCE PREVENTION**

Since its inception in 2005 through March 31, 2011, the New York City Healthy Relationship Training Academy of the Mayor's Office to Combat Domestic Violence has reached 20,209 young people through 1,022 peer education workshops. **PROJECT H.E.A.L. (Hospital Emergency Assistance Link)**

City public hospitals have digital cameras that document injuries and Domestic Violence Coordinators who assist victims and connect them with social and legal services.

**NEW YORK CITY FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER, BROOKLYN**

Since opening in July 2005 through March 31, 2011, this center has served 40,587 new clients seeking domestic violence services and 7,168 children were supervised in the Center's Children's Room, Margaret's Place. There have been 83,549 adult client visits to the Center since it opened.

**NEW YORK CITY FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER, QUEENS**

Since opening in July 2008 through March 31, 2011, this center has served 10,449 new clients seeking domestic violence services and 2,096 children were supervised in the Center's Children's Room, Margaret's Place. There have been 27,015 client visits to the Center since it opened.

**NEW YORK CITY FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER, BRONX**

Since opening in April 2010 through March 31, 2011, this center has served 5,207 new clients seeking domestic violence services and 877 children were supervised in the Center's Children's Room. There have been 11,264 client visits to the Center since it opened.
