

MAYOR'S OFFICE TO COMBAT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE: 2015 FACT SHEET

2015 KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- There were 26 intimate partner homicides and the New York City Police Department responded to over 279,051 domestic incidents.
- There were over 59,000 client visits to the New York City Family Justice Centers – 8% increase from 2014.
- The New York City Healthy Relationship Training Academy conducted a total of 307 workshops and trained 6,671 youth, parents and organizational staff.
- OCDV conducted over 1,600 outreach events (an annual increase of 77%) and distributed more than 315,800 pieces of public education material (an annual increase of 19%).

Intimate partner homicide and domestic incident report data is preliminary and subject to further revision by NYPD.

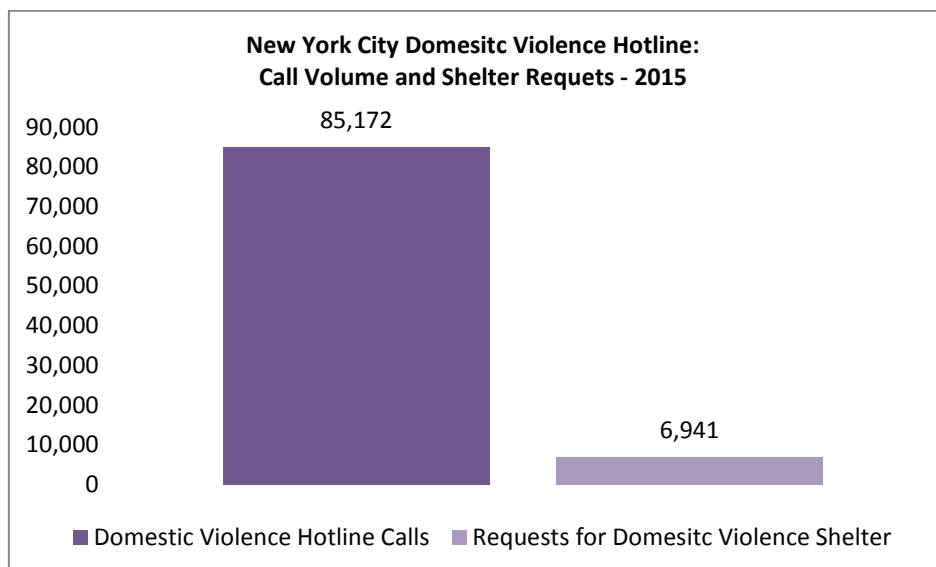

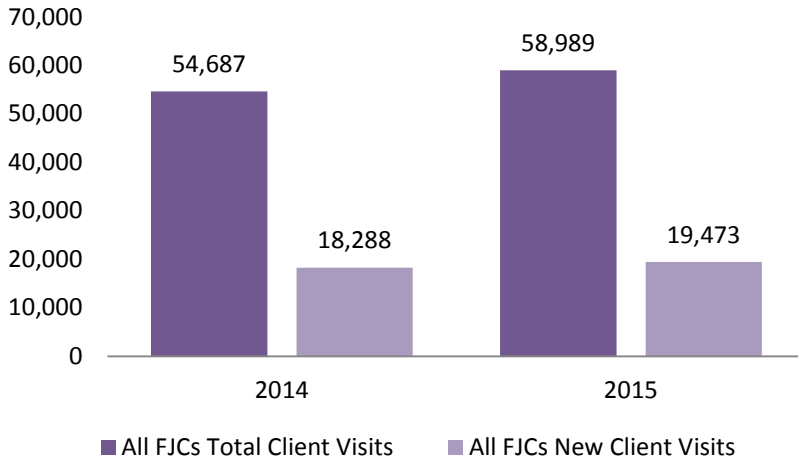
New York City Domestic Violence Hotline Calls and Requests for Shelter

New York City Family Justice Centers

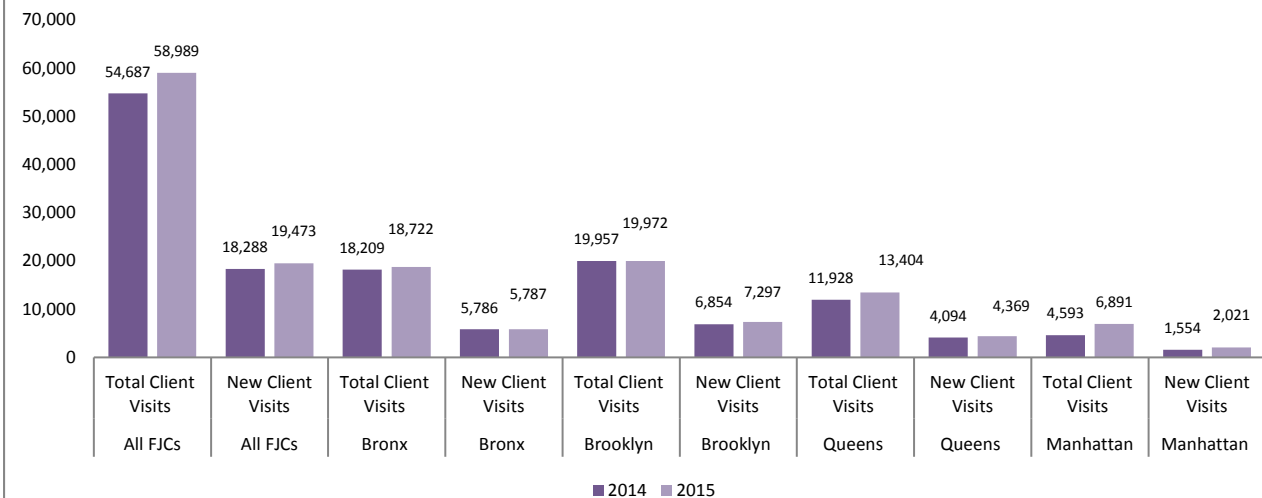
**Client Visits to All Family Justice Centers (FJCs):
2015 vs. 2014**



Compared to 2014, in 2015:

- There was an 8% increase in client visits to the NYC FJCs.
- There was a 6.5% increase in new clients visiting the NYC FJCs.

New York City Healthy Relationship Training Academy

- In 2015, the Academy conducted **265** workshops with **5,940** youth.
- In 2015, the Academy conducted **42** workshops/trainings with **731** parents and organizational staff.
- In 2015, in total the Academy conducted **307** workshops and trainings with **6,671** youth, parents and organizational staff.
