World Cares Center's mission is to foster sustainable, locally led disaster preparedness programs and to bring disaster relief resources to the most vulnerable, and especially older populations. Through the program, local residents are put in a community group called the "Senior Partners and Neighbors" (SPAN) to help them prepare for disasters. WCC's mission has been shown through its work in the field, a decade of continuous research and has been featured in TV, radio and print media.
