## NYC VCP Cleanup Plan Remedial Activities to Begin

The New York City Office of Environmental Remediation (OER) is providing this Fact Sheet pursuant to the New York City Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP). OER has approved the Remedial Action Work Plan (RAWP) submitted by SYG Realties, LLC for 140 Vanderbilt Avenue, Brooklyn, New York (Block 2046, Lot 84). The remedial work will begin in June 2015. The RAWP can be reviewed electronically or in person at the document repositories identified in the box at left.

### Site Description:

The 14,770 square-foot site is currently developed with a Gulf service station. The proposed use of the site is a new a 6-story mixed use building with a cellar across the entire property.

### Summary of the Remedy:

The remedial action for 140 Vanderbilt Avenue is a Track 4 Site-specific Use cleanup. The specific elements of the proposed remedial action include:

- Preparation of a Community Protection Statement and performance of all required NYC VCP citizen participation activities according to an approved Citizen Participation Plan;
- Performance of a Community Air Monitoring Program for particulates and volatile organic carbon compounds;
- Establishment of Track 4 Site-Specific Soil Cleanup Objectives (SCOs); Excavation and removal of soil/fill in excess of SCOs;
- Screening of excavated soil/fill during intrusive work for indications of contamination by visual means, odor, and monitoring with a PID. Appropriate segregation of excavated media on-Site;
- Transportation and off-site disposal of all soil/fill material at permitted facilities in accordance with applicable laws and regulations;
- Removal of underground storage tanks and closure of NYSDEC petroleum spill number 97-12610 in compliance with applicable local, State and Federal laws and regulations;
- Collection and analysis of end-point samples to determine if the remedy attains SCOs;
- Installation of a vapor barrier system below the concrete slab of the building as well as behind foundation walls of the proposed building;
- Construction and maintenance of an engineered composite cover consisting of 6 inch thick concrete building slab to prevent human exposure to residual soil/fill remaining under the Site;
- Submission of a Remedial Action Report (RAR) that describes the remedial activities and certifies that the remedial requirements have been achieved and lists any changes from this RAWP;
- Submission of an approved Site Management Plan (SMP) in the RAR for long-term management of residual contamination, including plans for maintenance, inspection and certification of Engineering and Institutional Controls and reporting at a specified frequency; and
- Continued registration with E-designation for the property.

Cleanup activities are scheduled to begin in June 2015 and are expected take approximately five months to complete.

**Next Steps:** After the enrollee completes the remedial work, a RAR will be prepared and submitted to OER. The RAR will describe the cleanup activities and certify that all cleanup requirements were met. Once the RAR is approved, OER will issue a Notice of Completion, a City liability release, and a New York City Green Property Certificate. OER will then issue a fact sheet announcing the completion of the remedial action and identify all engineering and institutional controls to be used at the Site.


