## NYC VCP Cleanup Plan Remedial Activities to Begin

The New York City Office of Environmental Remediation (OER) is providing this Fact Sheet pursuant to the New York City Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP). OER has approved the Remedial Action Work Plan (RAWP) submitted by Manhattan Avenue Development, LLC for 387 Manhattan Avenue, Brooklyn, New York (Block 2738, Lot 21). The remedial work will begin in June 2015. The RAWP can be reviewed electronically or in person at the document repositories identified in the box at left.

### Site Description:

The Site is 5,000 square feet and currently utilized as a parking lot, containing no buildings. The proposed future use of the Site will be a multi-story, mixed-use commercial and residential building with no basement.

### Summary of the Remedy:

The remedial action for 387 Manhattan Avenue is a Track 4 Site Specific Use cleanup. The specific elements of the proposed remedial action include:

- Preparation of a Community Protection Statement and performance of all required NYC VCP citizen participation activities according to an approved Citizen Participation Plan;
- Performance of a Community Air Monitoring Program for particulates and volatile organic carbon compounds;
- Establishment of Track 4 Site-Specific Soil Cleanup Objectives (SCOs); Excavation and removal of soil/fill in excess of SCOs;
- Transportation and off-site disposal of all soil/fill material at permitted facilities in accordance with applicable laws and regulations;
- Collection and analysis of end-point samples to determine if the remedy attains Track 4 SCOs;
- Installation of a vapor barrier/waterproofing membrane system below the slab on-grade portion of the building, as well as behind subgrade portions of foundation walls of the proposed building;
- Construction and maintenance of an engineered composite cover of the concrete building slab to prevent human exposure to residual soil/fill remaining under the Site.
- Submission of an approved Site Management Plan (SMP) in the Remedial Action Report (RAR) for long-term management of residual historic fill; and
- Submission of a RAR that describes the remedial activities, certifies that the remedial requirements have been achieved, defines the Site boundaries, and describes all engineering and institutional controls to be implemented at the Site.

Cleanup activities are scheduled to begin in June 2015 and are expected take approximately one month to complete.

**Next Steps:** After the enrollee completes the remedial work, a RAR will be prepared and submitted to OER. The RAR will describe the cleanup activities and certify that all cleanup requirements were met. Once the RAR is approved, OER will issue a Notice of Completion, a City liability release, and a New York City Green Property Certificate. OER will then issue a fact sheet announcing the completion of the remedial action and identify all engineering and institutional controls to be used at the Site.


