

April 2013 New York City Jobs Report for Education and Workforce Providers

OVERVIEW

- New York City's seasonally adjusted *unemployment rate decreased* from March to April 2013 from 8.9% to 8.4%. This is lower than the City's unemployment rate of 9.4% one year ago.
- New York City's unemployment rate this month is higher than the state's (7.8) and the nation's (7.5). New York City's unemployment rate has been higher than the nation's for 20 months.


1-YEAR CHANGES

- New York City gained 82,100 private sector jobs since April 2012. The City's private sector growth rate this year (+2.5%) was stronger than the state's (1.9%) and the nation's (+2.0%).
- Over the past year, the sectors with the most *job growth* were health care and social assistance (+21,700), concentrated in ambulatory health care services; administrative and support and waste management (+21,700), concentrated in employment services; and retail trade (11,300), concentrated in food and beverage stores and in clothing stores.
- The largest *job losses* were in government (-3,200), concentrated in local government; finance and insurance (-2,500), concentrated in securities and commodity contracts; and management of companies (-2,400).

THIS MONTH'S MAJOR TRENDS

- The City gained 35,100 private sector jobs this month, about 23,500 jobs more than average for this time of year.
- The greatest *job gains* in the past month were in accommodation and food services (+10,100), concentrated in food services and drinking places; administrative and support and waste management (+6,800), concentrated in employment services; and health care and social assistance (+4,000), concentrated in ambulatory health care services.
- The worst job losses in the past month were in management of companies (-600); finance and insurance (-200), concentrated in credit intermediation and related activities; and manufacturing (-200), concentrated in non-durable goods.
