


June 2013 New York City Jobs Report for Education and Workforce Providers

OVERVIEW

- New York City's seasonally adjusted *unemployment rate increased slightly* from 8.3% to 8.4%. This is lower than the City's unemployment rate of 9.4% one year ago.
- New York City's unemployment rate this month is higher than the state's (7.5%) and the nation's (7.6%). New York City's unemployment rate has been higher than the nation's for 22 months.

1-YEAR CHANGES


- New York City gained 78,400 private sector jobs since June 2012. The City's private sector growth rate this year (+2.3%) was stronger than the state's (1.5%) and the nation's (+2.0%).
- Over the past year, the sectors with the most *job growth* were health care and social assistance (+21,100), concentrated in ambulatory health care services; administrative and support and waste management (+14,200), concentrated in employment services; and educational services (+12,300), concentrated in colleges, universities, and professional schools.
- The largest *job losses* were in information (-5,300), concentrated in motion picture and sound recording; government (-2,800), concentrated in local government; and management of companies (-2,000).
 THIS MONTH'S MAJOR TRENDS
- The City gained 18,100 private sector jobs this month, substantially more than what is typical for this time of year.
- The greatest *job gains* in the past month were in finance and insurance (+6,700), concentrated in securities, commodity contracts, and other financial investment and related activities; construction and mining (+5,700), concentrated in building equipment contracts; and accommodation and food services (+4,500), concentrated in full-service restaurants.
- The worst *job losses* in the past month were in educational services (-9,700), concentrated in colleges, universities, and professional schools, which is typical for this time of year; government (-6,600), concentrated in local government; and administrative and support and waste management (-500), concentrated in employment services.
