

August 2013 New York City Jobs Report for Education and Workforce Providers

OVERVIEW

- New York City's seasonally adjusted *unemployment rate increased slightly* from July to August from 8.4% to 8.6%. This is lower than the City's unemployment rate of 9.3% one year ago.
- New York City's unemployment rate this month is higher than the state's (7.6%) and the nation's (7.3%). New York City's unemployment rate has been higher than the nation's for 24 months.

1-YEAR CHANGES


- New York City gained 84,700 private sector jobs since August 2012. The City's private sector growth rate this year (+2.5%) was stronger than the state's (1.7%) and the nation's (+2.0%).
- Over the past year, the sectors with the most *job growth* were health care and social assistance (+18,000), concentrated in ambulatory health care services; educational services (+14,100), concentrated in colleges, universities, and professional schools; and retail trade (+9,800), concentrated in clothing stores.
- The largest *job losses* were in information (-2,800), concentrated in publishing industries (except Internet); finance and insurance (-2,000), concentrated in securities and commodity contracts; and management of companies (-2,000).

THIS MONTH'S MAJOR TRENDS

- The City lost 2,300 private sector jobs this month, far less than what is typical for this time of year.
- The greatest *job gains* in the past month were in administrative and support and waste management (+2,200), concentrated in employment services; professional, scientific, and technical services (+1,900), concentrated in advertising and related services; retail trade (+1,800), concentrated in food and beverage stores; and manufacturing (+1,800), concentrated in non-durable goods.
- The worst *job losses* in the past month were in government (-11,300), concentrated in local government; real estate and rental and leasing (-3,800), concentrated in real estate; and finance and insurance (-2,200), concentrated in securities, commodity contracts, and other financial investment and related activities.
