



NEW YORK CITY GRADUATION RATES CLASS OF 2011 (2007 COHORT)

Over 52,000 students who entered 9th grade in 2007 graduated high school 4 years later




AFTER REMAINING NEARLY FLAT FOR 10 YEARS, NYC'S GRADUATION RATE HAS INCREASED BY 41 PERCENT SINCE 2005 AS MEASURED BY THE STATE



4-, 5-, & 6-YEAR GRADUATION RATES

For students entering 9th grade in 2006, 65.1% graduated by August of their fourth year. An additional 5.3% (4,702 students) graduated by August of their fifth year.




■ 4-Year Graduation Rate



GRADUATION RATES AT NEW SCHOOLS ARE HIGHER THAN AT THE HIGH SCHOOLS THEY REPLACED

- In 2006, all phasing-out high schools had a graduation rate of 38.0%. In 2011, all new high schools had a graduation rate of 70.1%.
- At the campuses below, the overall graduation rate increased from 35.7% at the large high schools in the building in 2002 to 68.0% in the new schools in the same building in 2011, which translates to 2,093 more graduates per year.






