Funding Source Description:

The Edward Byrne Memorial Competitive Grant Program will help communities improve the capacity of state and local justice systems and provide for national support efforts including training and technical assistance programs strategically targeted to address local needs. This grant focuses on initiatives in eight areas: 1) preventing and reducing violent crime through community-based data-driven approaches; 2) providing funding for neighborhood-based probation and parole officers; 3) reducing mortgage fraud and crime related to vacant properties; 4) hiring of civilian support personnel in law enforcement (training staff, analysts, dispatchers, etc.); 5) enhancing forensic and crime scene investigations; 6) improving resources and services for victims of crime; 7) supporting problem-solving courts; and 8) national training and technical assistance partnerships.

Grant Description:

Grant funds will enable a technological upgrade to the NYPD Crime Data Warehouse and Real Time Crime Center, including new server and network equipment, software, and expanded data mining infrastructure. While these resources through the CompStat forum have been proven invaluable to the NYPD's continued work in reducing crime levels in New York City, their current configuration limits their accessibility to law enforcement personnel.

Grant Amount: \$3,956,682

Anticipated benefits:

The increased capacity of the CDW and RTCC will enable the NYPD to expand utilization of the system from the current 1,500 users to 9,000 users, vastly improving the Department's capability to apprehend violent criminals and augment the crime rate decrease that use of CompStat has already facilitated. Implementation of the CDW and RTCC upgrade would employ ten consultants.
