It is anticipated that the payment structure of contracts awarded under this RFP will be based on lineitem budget reimbursement.

is deleted and replaced with the following:

It is anticipated that the payment structure of contracts awarded under this RFP will be based on line-item budget reimbursement, however full payment is subject to the availability of eligible clients for referral. Up to 25% of the annual contract amount will be withheld based on the actual number of participants referred by DOP and enrolled.

4. Section II- Summary of the Request for Proposals, page 9, G. Service Levels/Geographic Areas to be Served: Under the last paragraph, the following sentence:

<u>DOP</u> reserves the right to reduce the number of contracted participants if there are fewer clients eligible for referral than anticipated.

is added.

CLARIFICATIONS

- 1. The staffing plan and budget proposed should assume full enrollment of the number of participants proposed.
- 2. For the purposes of this RFP, a Linkage Agreement (Attachment #4) is not needed to demonstrate a relationship between the proposing organization and a City Agency, including local schools and police precincts. A letter of support could be used to document these relationships. A linkage agreement may be used to demonstrate a programmatic service to be delivered with another City Agency; however the City reserves the right to approve or disapprove any request based on business integrity and past history.
