PROJECT OVERVIEW

The New York City Department of Environmental Protection (NYCDEP) is installing a new sewer overflow conveyance pipe under the belt parkway. This project will contribute to an ongoing NYCDEP program to improve the quality of NYC's water bodies and reduce Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) discharges. This will improve the water quality of Bergen and Thurston Basins.

PROPOSED WORK SCHEDULE

September 2014 to February 2017

PROJECT SCOPE

Work on this project will include, but is not limited to:

- Installation of new overflow sewer line by microtunneling methods
- Shaft construction
- Manhole access construction
- Utility bypassing
- Curb cutting and traffic redirection
- Tree removal/planting
- Site Restoration

WORK HOURS

- 7:00 AM – 3:30PM, Monday to Friday
- 10:00AM – 3:00PM, Saturday and Sunday (as necessary)
- Nighttime work in Belt Parkway (as necessary)

COMMUNITY IMPACTS

During construction hours, you can expect the following:

- Increased levels of dust, noise and heavy equipment
- Vehicular travel lane closures will be required, as well as detours (Warning signs will be posted in advance).
- Nighttime work will involve use of high powered construction lighting.
- Parking and driveway restrictions, signs will be posted within the affected areas
- Pedestrian access to buildings will be maintained at all time.
