SPOTLIGHT ON OUR NEIGHBORHOODS-BAYSIDE

The name was given by Judge Lawrence in the 1820's to distinguish the area near Little Neck Bay from Flushing. It is a neighborhood of single-family homes with some garden apartment complexes. Bell Boulevard, named for its first landowner, Abraham Bell, is a busy, commercial district with many fine restaurants and stores along with the commercial strip on Northern Boulevard. Two Mayors are interred in the historic Lawrence Cemetery on 216 Street. Bayside has several large beautiful parks, John Golden Park, Crocheron Park and Lake, Oakland Lake Park and Alley Pond Park. Queensborough Community College, a first rate, two-year City of New York College is located at Springfield Boulevard and the Long Island Expressway.
