OLDER ADULT PROGRAMS AT THE “Y”

The Samuel Field Y located at 58-20 Little Neck Pkwy., is pleased to provide several services for older adults in our area. The Neighborhood Senior Center provides various programs such as movies, mind aerobics, art classes, trips and lunch. The Early Stage Memory Care Program is for those diagnosed with memory loss and provides support for caregivers. The Family Respite Program is for people with mild to moderate memory loss and includes daily activities. The CAPE program is a community mental health clinic serving those over 50 in need of counseling. Additionally, the Samuel Field Y is developing “Y-Town”, a program for homeowners in Douglaston and Little Neck to provide services without the formal center. They are looking for your input. Why we post demolition notices!

The Building Code requires owners to notify the Community Board and adjacent owners prior to the demolition of a building. Additionally, the Dept. of Buildings Commissioner has asked that owners notify the Board of any major alterations with partial demolitions.

Why we post liquor license applications!

The NYS Liquor Authority asks the CB to review the applications and renewals to determine if there are any problems with the establishment. We consult with the NYPD. Our Public Safety Committee meets to review problematic locations and advise SLA accordingly.
