LET'S IMPROVE OUR HEALTH

The National Center for Health Statistics, part of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, is undertaking a major study of the health of people living in the United States. The borough of Queens was selected as one of the survey locations and 399 people will be asked to participate. Between April 25th and June 27th interviewers will be calling designated households. The study includes interviews and physical exams. These surveys help the public and private sector organizations learn the causes of disease, detect the extent of various health problems, risk factors and how they might have changed over time and helps establish policies and programs for the future.

KNOW IT, AVOID IT, REPORT IT

The Federal government is cracking down on scammers who prey on homeowners having trouble paying their mortgages. Scam artists pose as financial advisors and/or debt relief consultants and make promises, too good to be true, to lower monthly payments and eliminate debt. What they really do is get homeowners to sign over the title to their property and/or redirect mortgage payments to the scammers. Don't accept unsolicited offers for loan modification if you have to pay a fee, sign a contract, sign over title to your property, redirect mortgage payments or told to stop making loan payments.
