PREPARING FOR FLOODS AND HURRICANES

The Dept. of City Planning has released reports to help residents along waterfront communities to prepare for coastal flood risks. One report, Designing for Flood Risk, is a guide for the design of new buildings. This study guided the DCP to revise the Zoning Resolution to include the proposed Flood Resilience Text Amendment that is currently in public review. Urban Waterfront Adaptive Strategies provides an assessment of the coastal flood hazards in New York City. These reports are available at www.nyc.gov/planning.

The Mayor has also released a study, A Stronger, More Resilient New York, which covers what the City can do to sustain communities in cases of flooding. The report is available on-line at www.nyc.gov.

The Office of Emergency Management has released its new hurricane evacuation map which has expanded the flood zone and includes six designated evacuation zones. This interactive map is available at www.nyc.gov/hurricane or call CB 11 for a copy of the brochure.

ADULT HEALTH SURVEY

The NYC Health Department and the CUNY School of Public Health will randomly select 3,000 New Yorkers this summer to participate in a health and nutrition examination survey, NYC HANES. If you are selected and contacted by the DOH, they hope that you will participate. Participants will receive \$100.00 to participate in a three-part study, a free physical, an interview and blood, urine and saliva tests. The study is looking to understand the occurrence of diabetes, high blood pressure, kidney disease, effects of tobacco and heavy metals.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

The NYC Dept. of Housing Preservation and Development announced the availability of affordable rental apartments at a newly constructed building at 23-10 41 Avenue in Long Island City.
