IS YOUR DOG A REAL NEW YORKER?

The NYC Department of Health wants all New Yorkers to know that dogs must be legally licensed. The owner of an unlicensed dog is subject to violations. By having your dog licensed, you can be reunited with a lost dog through the Dog eLocator on the DOH website, www.health/nyc.gov. If your dog is found, the Health Department can be called with the tag number and you will be contact by email or phone. If your dog is already licensed, go to the website and be sure that your contact information is up- to -date. And remember, be a responsible dog owner, obey sanitation laws and pick up after your dog.
