QUEENS FORESTRY AT WORK

The Parks Dept. received 2623 forestry requests last fiscal year, July 2014-June 2015. There were 348 emergency requests for fallen trees, limbs, uprooted trees, and hanging limbs. There were 555 routine jobs to remove trees and stumps, prune trees and inspect for the Tree & Sidewalk program. 1600 street trees and 273 park trees were pruned during block pruning.

NYC DOT AT WORK

Last fiscal year, FY 2016, the Dept. of Transportation Road Crews resurfaced 34.3 lane miles in CB 11. This year, DOT plans on resurfacing 36.15 lane miles. Since January, DOT filled 127,089 potholes in Queens. Citywide, DOT installed 140 speed cameras, 250 speed bumps and installed five Slow Zones and 1,630 countdown signals in Queens.

FIGHTING DISCRIMINATION

This NYC Service program partners with the United Way of New York City and the Franklin Project, to unite professionals to serve full-time for 10-months at City agencies and their partner non-profit organizations to address community needs. NEW HIGH SCHOOL

The School Construction Authority is in contract to purchase the Bayside Jewish Center at 32 Ave. and 204 St., pending approval by the City Council, to build a new 739-seat high school. Community Board 11 will hold a public hearing pursuant to Section 1731 of the NYC School Construction Authority Act on November 2nd. The Citywide Council of High Schools will also hold a public hearing. The proposal is then sent to the City Council for Land Use Committee hearings and a final vote by the Council members.
