RECYCLING LAWS EXPANDED

The Mayor signed into law 12 bills revising and updating the City's recycling law. This legislation will study ways to improve commercial waste recycling, establish a paint reclamation system for accepting unused and leftover paint, increase fines for violations in multiple dwellings, conduct outreach and training for large apartment buildings, expand plastic recycling to include rigid containers, expands public space recycling, requires yearly household hazardous waste collection, improves recycling at schools and public offices, studies means of diverting food waste to compost, but it also suspends the collection of yard waste and restricts the placing of grass clippings out with the regular household waste. As we learn more about how the City will implement these changes, we will let you know.
