HAVE A COMPLAINT? CALL 3-1-1 FIRST

Whether you like it or not, 3-1-1 is the go-to number for citywide service complaints. There is a method to this "madness". When you call 3-1-1 to make a complaint about a street condition, street lights and signals, potholes, trees, garbage, graffiti, etc., the operator sends your complaint via computer to the necessary agency. The agency receives a printout of locations. You are given a number by the operator. **KEEP THIS SERVICE REQUEST NUMBER.** If the problem you reported is not taken care of, please call Board office *with the number* and we will contact the agency. If the 3-1-1 operator has a problem understanding your complaint or the location of the complaint, call CB11, we understand the neighborhood better and will go directly to the agency, if necessary. Many types of complaints can also be entered online at www.nyc.gov.

THE CITY ON THE WEB
