**SPOTLIGHT ON DOUGLSTON**

The Douglaston community covers the Douglas Manor peninsula south to the Grand Central Parkway and from the Cross Island Pkwy. east to Marathon Pkwy. The area was inhabited by Native Americans then the Dutch and British settled here in the 1660’s. In the 1800’s the Douglas family bought and developed the farmland for housing and the name was adopted for the neighborhood. The LIRR extension brought more families and growth. Cooperative garden apartments and single family homes continued to be developed between the 1920s and 1940s. Douglas Manor and Douglaston Hill are landmarked neighborhoods. Alley Creek flows on both sides of Northern Boulevard. The Udalls Cove Preservation Committee works hard to preserve these wetland areas for future generations. The Alley Pond Environmental Center and the Douglaston Golf Driving Range and Douglaston Golf Course provide fun activities for children and adults.
