TRANSPORTATION ISSUES

- Update by Chair on the Kosciuszko Bridge tour
- Continue discussion of Queens Blvd Safety Improvement Project.
 - Backup onto the BQE at Queens Blvd exit.(CB 2 received many complaints)
- DOT to provide an update Continue discussion and update on site visit and continue discussion on the Hunters Point Avenue and Greenpoint Avenue area study that was to be completed regarding traffic and the conversion around the gas station at 36th Street, and how cars use this location at Hunters Point Avenue as a short cut to get through the gas station. CB 2 had requested that 36th Street be turned into a one-way conversion northbound rather than southbound, to resolve this issue (CB2 sent letter on June 15, 2011) DOT stated a study (no tracking number or letter provided).
- Follow up on Safety Improvement Issues
 - Discussion on new community complaints received about traffic safety with regard to the bicycle lanes on Greenpoint Avenue by the LIE overpass.

 - Installing one speed bump at Barnett Avenue between 47th and 48th Avenue.(DOT-214750-P2K8)
 - Installing speed bump 65th Street between 37th Avenue and 37th Road. (DOT-58287-BIC7)
 - Update on request (CB 2 sent letter January 15, 2015) for the installation of a speed hump on 41st Street between 47th Avenue and Queens Blvd.(did not received tracking letter from DOT)

 - City Bench to be approved at the location of 45-02 23rd Street. Cross street 45th Road and 45th Avenue.
- Discussion of request of a stop sign at the location at 5th Street and 46th Avenue. (Original request by CB 2 November 2013) (DOT did not provide a tracking number)

- Continue discussion on improvements at Borden Avenue and Greenpoint Avenue. Provide an update on traffic signal time study. (CB2 sent letter March 17, 2015) (DOT did not provide a letter with a tracking number).
- Discussion of feasibility of a request for "No Parking Signage" at 47th avenue between 50th Street and 51st Street (CB2 sent letter August 7, 2015) (DOT did not provide a letter with tracking number).
